The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge have a lot in common, including their collegiate structure, more personalised teaching methods and a wealth of resources available to students. Depending on the course, conditional A level offers range between A*A*A – AAA.

What makes our Oxbridge Preparation Programme special?

We understand that everyone's journey is unique and, dependent on the course you wish to apply for at Oxbridge, you will require bespoke guidance and support. As a member of our Oxbridge programme, you will get additional lessons dedicated specifically to developing and strengthening your Oxbridge application:

- Working in a small group of bright and enthusiastic students you will participate in our regular seminar-style lessons, Oxbridge talks and special Oxbridge events.
- In addition, you will receive individual guidance and support on your application, assessments and interview. You will also be guided with subject-specific preparation for your Oxbridge assessment. For example, if applying for Engineering, you will receive some additional sessions in Physics. You can then continue with your preparation via our 1:1 support route.

Below we have selected the key milestones of a successful Oxbridge application and explain how we will support you during your programme with us:

Personal Statement

This is required from all Oxbridge candidates. A competitive Personal Statement allows you to stand out and demonstrate your suitability for your chosen course at Oxbridge.

How do you compete with the best?

Discussion of academic enrichment will usually take up the majority of a competitive Personal Statement. Your Personal Statement is your unique opportunity to demonstrate your subject-specific academic exploration that both builds on and goes beyond your A levels.

You will be encouraged to explore your subject in greater depth in your own time, and will deliver class presentations on your exploration. There are ample suitable resources available.

We will guide you with constructing an effective Personal Statement which reflects on your wider reading, critical thinking, work experience and leadership skills.

Oxbridge tests and assessments

This is a crucial aspect of your preparation and, dependent on the course you choose to apply for, you will be required to take specific Oxbridge tests and assessments (in addition to your A levels).

How do you excel in your Oxbridge tests & assessments? How do universities use these results when selecting successful applicants?

Both universities require some applicants to take special tests & assessments and submit samples of written work as part of their application.

At Cambridge, most applicants are required to take a written assessment. This could be before, after or during your interview. These provide an assessment of relevant skills (writing and language ability) and your level of knowledge and understanding for the course you applied for. Oxford requires applicants to take written tests before interview for most courses.

During your programme, you will not only learn more about the specific test you need to take, but will also get a chance to prepare, practise and learn from the feedback that you receive. All this will give you a chance to showcase your ability on the big day.

Oxbridge interview

Your interview with academic staff from Cambridge or Oxford will determine if you are best-suited for studies at Oxbridge. No one is offered a place to study at Oxbridge without an interview, therefore preparation is key.

What should you expect from your Oxbridge interview and what are admission tutors looking for? How should you present and prepare yourself?

Oxbridge interviews are unique and very different, partly because all applicants are brilliant and promise equally outstanding results.

Our subject experts have a lot of advice to give you. During your programme, you will get more insight into Oxbridge interviews in general as well as subject-specific guidance.

You will also have Oxbridge mock interview practice. This will give you a chance to act on specific feedback relating to your performance before your big day.

Critical thinking, excellent problem solving and intellectual flexibility

A successful Oxbridge candidate is expected to demonstrate outstanding factual knowledge, motivation and suitability to small group teaching. Furthermore, successful candidates need to display critical thinking and problem-solving skills as well as intellectual flexibility.

During your interview, Admission tutors will ask you challenging, academic questions to determine whether you can problem-solve and build on the knowledge you already have.

A good example of an assessment which aims to assess your critical thinking and problem-solving skills is TSA (Thinking Skills Assessment).

During your programme you will have additional lessons aimed specifically at developing your critical thinking, problem solving and mathematical skills which you will need for a successful progression to Oxbridge.
